### **Curriculum Planning:**

We do not have a planned topic each term. At James Lee we prefer "Planning in the Moment" and focus more on child initiated play. Please see the board in the entrance hall for more information or speak to your child's keyworker.

### School Clothing:

An important part of the EYFS curriculum is for children to explore and learn through play. This means that children will be involved in many different and **often messy** sensory experiences both inside and outside the classroom. Bearing this in mind please ensure children are suitably dressed in clothes that can get messy.

### Spare clothes bag:

Please remember to check your child's change of clothes bag **at the end of each day** to see if it needs topping up.

**Note:** Please put your child's name in their clothing.

### Labelling your child's clothing

Could we ask all parents to label their children's clothing in particular coats, hats, scarfs and gloves. As you can appreciate it can be very difficult to keep track of 60 coats, 60 hats, 60 scarfs and 120 gloves!! Could you also ensure your child has spare socks in their bag. Thank you.

### School Lunch:



Lunch is £2.00 per day, £10 per week payable in advance. If you wish to pay for a term or half a term, please check with Reception staff who can advise you of the amount. All payments must be made online via EduSpot.

### Monday Singalong sessions!



Our sing-a-long sessions will start **A** again on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March. The children were really involved and exercising their vocal chords! If you are able to come along then please do, siblings also welcome! Sessions are every Monday at 2.40pm so arrive at 2:35pm so we can start promptly.

### Breakfast club/Friday Crèche

Breakfast club runs from 8 - 9.15am and cost  $\pounds$ 3.50 per session. Crèche is on Fridays from 12.30–3.00pm and costs £7.50 per session. Crèche is free for parents with a 30 hours free childcare code and priority for places goes to working/studying parents.

If you book a place for the Crèche or Breakfast Club and need to cancel, **please give us 24 hours' notice or you will still be charged**.

### **Forest School**

Forest School sessions will start again on Thursday 28 February. Your keyworker will inform you if your child is in this first group.

Pictures will be up on the plasma screen in the reception area to keep you updated on all the fun they had.
